Summer Journeys

Our lives are filled with journeys. In fact, we often hear that Life is a journey! Many of us are traveling this summer—some are returning to favorite vacation spots to be with family and friends—others are traveling to see unique vistas and wildlife. Wherever your travels take you, may they be safe.

Our recent trip to El Paso, Texas, to visit our son and daughter-in-law was filled with sightseeing in extremely hot temperatures. Our son roused us from bed in the wee hours of the morning so that we could be on the road by 5:30 am to see some wondrous sights of the region. One visit was to White Sands National Park, one of the world's great natural wonders in the heart of the Tularosa Basin. Great wave-like dunes of gypsum sand engulf 275 square miles of desert, creating the world's largest gypsum dune field. The Park preserves a major portion of this unique dune field, along with the plants and animals that live there. We wanted to stumble upon an ocean, but that is not in this landscape! It was breathtaking to see.

The barrenness of this white sand landscape reminds me of the miles of sand, sparse vegetation, mountains, and water ways that the ancient patriarchs of the Old Testament traveled in obedience to God's covenant. This summer, we are traveling with Father Abraham and his offspring, Isaac, Jacob and Esau, and Joseph to learn about the trials and tribulations of barren wombs, dysfunctional family dynamics, and the steadfast mercy and love of our God of abundant grace. Such journeys teach us that God provides for us, especially in our times of great distress (story of Hagar and Ishmael), that God fulfills the covenant made with Abram by making barren wombs fertile, that God shapes us from our inward focused selves to outward focused servants who are obedient to God's call (Jacob — later known as Israel), and that what humans intend for evil, God turns into good (Joseph forgives his brothers).

The Jacob and Esau story followed by the Joseph story, are two literary masterpieces of the Bible. Begin your reading with Genesis 12 when God calls Abram and Sarai to leave their homeland in Ur of the Chaldeans (today about 200 miles southeast of Baghdad in lower Mesopotamia) to travel to Canaan; continue through the end of Genesis, to chapter 50. Yes this seems like a lot of reading, but spending time with these chapters will fill the gaps of the lectionary readings each week.

Journeys, whether physical and/or spiritual, allow us to set aside time to reflect, refresh

and to renew our spiritual lives, cleansing clutter and baggage that weigh us down. Life is a journey. Let's embrace this journey and give thanks for the steadfast mercy and love of our God of abundant grace, who never abandons us.

The problem (and power) of money

[Jesus told the rich man] "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions. ... [Jesus taught the disciples,] "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." – **Mark 10:21b-22, 25**

At a Bible study, a man of means asked, "Why does Jesus hate money so much?" His family saw their money as a good thing, and he earnestly wanted to understand why Jesus seems to speak negatively of wealth again and again.

In fact, Jesus talks about money more than nearly anything else. Interestingly, for all his talk about money, he never asks for it. And he never condemns it. Instead, Jesus warns us about the corrupting influence of money.

Wealth poses spiritual risks. Jesus teaches that money has the power to turn us inward – away from loving God with all our heart and loving our neighbor as ourselves. It confuses our values and direction.

All of us want full lives brimming with security, relationship, joy, peace and love – but money can ensure us none of those things. They are the fruits of loving God with ALL our strength and of loving our neighbor as ourselves. Wealth can get in the way.

That was the issue with the rich man in Mark 10:17-27. Deeply religious, he nonetheless worries about eternal life. The "one thing" he lacks, Jesus tells him, can be satisfied by selling what he has and giving to the poor. Generous giving would break the bond that money has over him and help re-center him on loving God and loving neighbor.

Generosity is the spiritual prescription Jesus gives the rich man, and it's the one for us, too.

The primary goal of our church's financial stewardship should not be to fund the church, but rather to break the chains that money may have on our hearts and souls. But giving generously we can help the church, our neighbor *and* ourselves. We can learn what it is to be free to love God with all our heart and our neighbor as ourselves.



Grace's Book Club


For August Grace's Book Club will be reading "West with Giraffes" by Lynda Rutledge.

"Few true friends have I know and two were giraffes...'Woodrow Wilson Nickel, age 105, feels his life ebbing away. But when he learns giraffes are going extinct, he finds himself recalling the unforgettable experience he cannot take to his grave. It's 1938. The Great Depression lingers. Hitler is threatening Europe, and world-weary Americans long for wonder. They find it in two

giraffes who miraculously survive a hurricane while crossing the Atlantic. What follows is a twelve-day road trip in a custom truck to deliver Southern California's first giraffes to the San

Diego Zoo. Inspired by true events, the tale weaves real-life figures with fictional ones, including the world's first female zoo director, a crusty old man with a past, a young female photographer with a secret, and assorted reprobates as spotty as the giraffes. Part adventure, part historical saga, and part coming-of-age love story, West with Giraffes explores what it means to be changed by the grace of animals, the kindness of strangers, the passing of time, and a story told before it's too late."


Dauphin County Parks & Recreation Sunset Movie Series
