He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. ⁴⁶ If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? ⁴⁸ Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect." -Matthew 5:43-48

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Our world, and especially our country, seems to becoming more and more divided. People are becoming increasingly less willing to listen to one another and would rather point the finger and place blame on an entire demographic of people, than come together to find common ground and develop common sense solutions to our problems. There has been rhetoric flowing around that some Americans are less American than others. There is even more harmful rhetoric that is being tossed around that some humans are less valuable or worse, less human than others. As a Christian, and as a human, this type of speech saddens me. As we all believe, humans were created in the image of God. That is all humans, not just the ones that we agree with. And it saddens me that our country is growing ever more hostile to one another. Jesus reminds us that we are to love our enemy, not hate them. This radical statement of Jesus, completely flips our understanding of how to navigate the world on its head. We want to hate our enemies, we

want to fight and destroy the people who we think are ruining our desired way of life. But Jesus is telling us no, don't hate them, don't even just tolerate them, love them. Learn to love your enemy, like you love your friends. For most of us, that is not something that we want to do. But as a disciple of Jesus Christ, I, and all Christians, are called to follow this command from our Lord. Loving your enemy doesn't mean loving the evil or the harm that they have done or are doing to you, or to others. But what loving your enemy means, is that we will not treat others, not even our enemy, the way our enemy is treating us. Just because our enemy is not living the way of the cross, does not give us, as disciples, a free pass to live in an unloving way. I want to point out that this is not easy. Being a Christian is not for the faint of heart. But it is, in my opinion, the only way to true peace and joy in this world.

When Jesus was dying on the cross, he could have been angry, bitter, resentful, not only to those who beat him and hung him on the cross. But also to God, for putting him in this situation to be tortured. But instead, Jesus asked God to forgive those who harmed him and killed him and said, Father, your will be done. Even in Jesus' most horrifically painful and emotionally traumatizing event on this earth, he had peace in his heart and found love for his enemies. Love for ones enemy doesn't mean that we don't speak up on things that we disagree with it. It doesn't mean that we have to allow our enemies to walk over us. But what it does mean, is that we who call ourselves disciples, will treat anyone on this earth with respect and dignity, as a beloved child of God. As Christians, we

The SAD News About Nutrition

U.S. medical data present a real paradox: Though we spend more on health care than any other developed country, we are very unhealthy – including shorter life expectancy, the highest obesity rate, and high incidence of diabetes, heart disease and hypertension.

The reasons are complex, but many experts point to the unhealthy "Standard American Diet." With lots of processed foods, saturated fats and refined carbohydrates, the SAD causes more deaths per year than smoking, and half of all heart-disease related deaths.

In other words, the food we eat is killing us. The culprits are the fried foods, the French fries, hamburgers, chips, donuts, prepackaged entrees, breakfast cereals, sugary soft drinks, pizza, candy, meat consumption and freezer-case meals.

The cure for SAD is simple: Eat less of the bad stuff and more fresh vegetables and fruit. When God put Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, they were given all sorts of fruits and veggies to eat (Genesis 1:29). So, as you eat more veggies, you can think of it as the Garden of Eden Diet.

August is the ideal time to load up on veggies. The summer harvest brings all the delightfully nutritious foods to your local farm market and grocery store. How healthy is your diet? To learn more, search online for "Standard American Diet" and see what the experts have to say.

The organ project may seem complete but we are not quite finished. We made all our payments to the company but have a few more dollars to raise to match what we paid them. Here is a recap of the payments we made:

November 2023: \$46,175 April 2024: \$46,175 April 2024: \$39,248.75 (5% held back for final acceptance)

June 2024: \$6,926.25 (the 5% due for final acceptance) June 2024: \$800 for shipping costs

Grand total paid: \$139,325

Meanwhile, we raised all the funding to pay for the grand total except for \$2,000.69. We are so close! Please consider donating a few dollars more and collectively we can close out this successful project.

The committee has been reviewing technology within the church. Office computers and the copier are getting replaced. It was also determined the sanctuary technology is in need of major improvements to the existing livestreaming, audio, speakers, projection, and video system in place. A permanent fixture for the screen or tv(s) is needed, speakers are old with some not working, projection equipment needs upgraded, the camera is currently being borrowed from a member, etc.

Over the past three years, the church has roughly one third of its worshippers who worship from home for various reason. Improving this technology is critical to the church and impacts a large portion of people. This will be a large project and will involve a significant investment by the church, but it will touch many people. Continued research, planning, and advertising will be made on this project.

The committee is asking all to realize this investment, as like many other investments, will impact and help many people. Technology does have an end-life and the current setup is fast approaching this point. Grace's Book Club will be taking their summer break in August. They will be reading "The Women" by Kristin Hannah for September 2024. Description

"An intimate portrait of coming of age in a dangerous time and an epic tale of a nation divided.

Women can be heroes. When twenty-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie" McGrath hears these words, it is a revelation. Raised in the sun-drenched, idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path.

As green and inexperienced as the men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is over- whelmed by the chaos and destruction of war. Each day is a gamble of life and death, hope and betrayal; friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. In war, she meets—and becomes one of—the lucky, the brave, the broken, and the lost.

But war is just the beginning for Frankie and her veteran friends. The real battle lies in coming home to a changed and divided America, to angry protesters, and to a country that wants to forget Vietnam.

The Women is the story of one woman gone to war, but it shines a light on all women who put themselves in harm's way and whose sacrifice and commitment to their country has too often been forgotten. A novel about deep friendships and bold patriotism, *The Women* is a richly drawn story with a memorable heroine whose idealism and courage under fire will come to define an era.

We will be welcoming Ms. Yesy Lopez from Hope Academy in Guatemala for our fall semester and will offer a Spanish immersion enrichment course 3 days a week in addition to our normal program. My daughter, Maddie, and I spent a week

in Guatemala at the school at the end of May and had an amazing time with the 120 girls who are learning and growing there everyday!

Tree 4 Hope, the parent non-profit of Hope Academy PA, is in the midst of their **Summer Push Campaign**. Donations to the campaign will help us complete the second floor of Hope Academy in Guatemala , provide sponsorships for 18 girls at the school there and also add to our Hope Academy PA scholarship fund for kids in need. Family Promise What They Do and How They Do It

Family Promise HCR assists families experiencing homelessness or who are in danger of becoming homeless.

Why a Family Shelter: Families are typically separated by gender at the age of 14. It is one of only three shelters in the Harrisburg area, which keeps families together.

How: It has a Day Center in Camp Hill where families spend the day. In the evening local congregations provide van transportation with the FPHCR van, sleeping accommodations(Sunday school

room, library etc.), and an evening meal. They also provide much needed compassion and caring. In the morning, families return to the Day Center to go to work or school, or work on their goals towards self-sufficiency.

We also have programs which "divert" families from homelessness, in the hopes that they won't need a shelter. FPHCR is a community response to homelessness, a community issue, offering congregations a way to positively affect families in their area.
