Let the Stable Still Astonish

Let the stable still astonish: Straw-dirt floor, dull eyes, Dusty flanks of donkeys, oxen; Crumbling, crooked walls; No bed to carry that pain, And then, the child, Rag-wrapped, laid to cry In a trough. Who would have chosen this? Who would have said: "Yes. Let the God of all the heavens and earth be born here, in this place."? Who but the same God Who stands in the darker, fouler rooms of our hearts and says, "Yes, let the God of Heaven and Earth be born here ---in this place."

I came across this poem several years ago while reading a book during the week between Christmas and New Year. I often turn to this poem, especially at this time of year—after the presents are unwrapped and put away, after family has returned to their homes, with the tree laden with ornaments on branches of dried needles. I continue to listen to Christmas music well into January because I don't want Christmas to "be over." In this New Year, I

wonder, how does the gift of Christmas in the birth of our Savior continue to astonish you? We can find ways to return to the stable, to ponder upon the Christ-child once again, and to invite Christ to be born again in our hearts—cold with envy, hate, anger, bitterness, resentment and all those things we call "sin." I offer some suggestions for you to "let the stable still astonish" in these cold, wintry days, when the warm glow of Christmas candles, the beauty of carols and the presence of family and friends are quickly fading into memories of another Christmas past.

I invite you to listen to your favorite Christmas carols a little longer—not only well into January but also throughout the year. Sing along! Ponder the texts that tell the story of Mary and Joseph, of a babe born in Bethlehem, of angels, shepherds and magi, and of King Herod who tried to destroy the good that God brought into the world.

I invite you to read this poem. Let the words hang on your lips and in your thoughts. Walk with these words. Share this poem with a friend who has lost a loved one or who is struggling with illness, or another crisis. Let the stable astonish them in a new way, offering comfort and consolation.

I invite you to use this poem as a prayer—for those who are in prison, persecuted, or held as hostages, for those who live in war-torn areas of our world. Pray that Christ may be born in the dark corners of their world to bring light into their hearts.

I invite you to let this poem carry you from dark places into the light of Christ—in this New Year and always.



Kentland Project Progress Report

This past month, the Kentland interior has really begun to take shape. The new ceiling and LED lights make the space look clean and bright, while the pine walls give it that rustic feel that we were hoping for. The restored fireplace now looks better than I ever imagined!

This past week our kitchen was installed, and a new refrigerator and range as well.

For the next two weeks, we will be concentrating on applying a clear sealer on our walls. This will take a significant effort as we have quite a bit of square feet of surface to seal. The good news is that this activity is very simple and straightforward; something that almost



everyone can help with. We will start the process by cleaning the walls, and then we will be brushing and rolling on the sealer. We will need two coats with some sanding in between coats so this will be a significant amount of hours to keep us busy for the next couple of weeks.

Looking forward then, our new flooring will be delivered after the new year, and we will concentrate on getting that installed.

Please feel free to come out and check things out! We continue to work Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays. *Note: There will be no work at Kentland on* December 23 & December 25. Work will resume on December 27 & 30. There will be no work on Monday, January 1, 2024 and work will resume again on Wednesday, January 3, 2024.

2024: Your year for abundant living




Dear members and friends of Grace,

Grape Juice now offered for communion/New Gluten Free Tray

Children and those who cannot/do not wish to receive wine now have the option to receive grape juice.

A separate cup tray, with 12 pre-filled cups of white grape juice, will be in a burgundy colored communion tray. Those who wish to receive grape juice are to pick up a pre-filled cup. After receiving bread, move to the pouring chalice. The server speaks the words, "The blood of Christ shed for you." Then, drink the juice and dispose of the cup in the basket.

The same cup tray (burgundy colored) has a center tray with the gluten free wafers. For those who need gluten free wafers, please take one from the center tray. Move to the pastor/assisting minister who speaks the words, "The body of Christ given for you." Then, eat your wafer before receiving wine.

Please do not take a cup of grape juice or a gluten free wafer unless you have a need for these elements. Bread and wine will continue to be distributed as in the past.

If all of the pre-filled cups are taken, then those communing may receive wine or choose not to receive a drink. One is considered fully communed by receiving either one or both elements.

Grace's book club has selected "**Before We Were Yours**" by Lisa Wingate.

Memphis, 1939. Twelve-year-old Rill Foss and her four younger siblings live a magical life aboard their family's Mississippi River shantyboat. But when their father must rush their mother to the hospital one stormy night, Rill is left in charge--until strangers arrive in force. Wrenched from all that is familiar and thrown into a Tennessee Children's Home Society

orphanage, the Foss children are assured that they will soon be returned to their parents--but they quickly realize the dark truth. At the mercy of the facility's cruel director, Rill fights to keep her sisters and brother together in a world of danger and uncertainty.

Aiken, South Carolina, present day. Born into wealth and privilege, Avery Stafford seems to have it all: a successful career as a federal prosecutor, a handsome fiancé, and a lavish wedding on the horizon. But when Avery returns home to help her father weather a health crisis, a chance encounter leaves her with uncomfortable questions and compels her to take a journey through her family's long-hidden history, on a path that will ultimately lead either to devastation or to redemption. Based on one of America's most notorious real-life scandals--in which Georgia Tann, director of a Memphis-based adoption organization, kidnapped and sold poor children to wealthy families all over the country--Lisa Wingate's riveting, wrenching, and ultimately uplifting tale reminds us how, even though the paths we take can lead to many places, the heart never forgets where we belong".

Lisa Wingate is a former journalist, an inspirational speaker, and the bestselling author of more than thirty books. Her blockbuster "Before We Were Yours" was on the NYT best seller list for over one year. Her work has won or been nominated for many awards, including the Pat Conroy Southern Book Prize, the Oklahoma Book Award, the Utah Library Award, the Carol Award, the Christy Award, and the RT Reviewers' Choice Award. Lisa believes stories can change the world.
