Our Purpose
The purpose of our church is to make a

Our time together has been a journey from one long-term pastor to the next—known as the interim time. We have moved through this time with patience and an openness to the ways that the Holy Spirit comes into our lives and stirs us to action. Now it is time to take all that has been learned and continue to practice our good behavior with everyone—inside and outside the walls of the church. You are a very different faith community from two years ago.

Not so long ago, my sermon was about "transitions" and the ways that we witness to others about the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Transition translates to change. A multitude of emotions accompany transitions. There is anxiety, nerves, a sense of loss and fear. There is excitement, happiness, gain and faith. Our response to transitions makes all of the difference in the effect on us.

Such is the case with pastoral leadership. You have voted to call a new pastor. This call means that the interim time will end, and yet, the call of a new pastor is the start of a new transition into the future. With new leadership, I trust that you will see the completion of projects started during the interim time and that you will engage new projects/outreach ministries as they "bubble up."

The most important thing is that you stay focused on moving forward with creative ideas that carry out your vision here at Grace. We have worked through many negative emotions

that were prevalent when I began to serve at Grace. You have turned your anger and dissatisfaction into joy and hopefulness. I pray that you will stay the course of looking to the future; please don't let frustration or disappointment cause you to return to what is easy or familiar (because that is often what we want to do when in stressful and trying situations), but be creative, be open-minded, and be prayerful! Congregations that do so are healthy, vibrant faith communities that make a difference in the local neighborhood and in the wider Church.

Over the next few weeks, I will attend to wrapping up some loose ends, visit the homebound members to say good-bye, and to celebrate our ministry together after the worship services on May 11 and 12.

Finally, I express my deep gratitude for you—
for all of you! You are a welcoming, kind, caring and most generous community of God's faithful children. Your positive attitude and lay leadership have brought you to where we are. With God's grace and love, and the Lord's hand leading us, let us go forth with excitement and encouragement, stirred and fed by the Holy Spirit. We just never know how the Spirit is going to work in our lives and in our faith communities. Be open to the voice of the Spirit and go where it guides you for you will not be disappointed!



Under Comments you may write the name of the organization(s) and the amount for each one if there are multiple selections.
- 5. Each envelope should contain only one (1) check. Please do not write separate checks for each organization.

THANK YOU! And an update from Seminarian Hope Pankake

Greetings, dear siblings in Christ!

First and foremost, I would like to thank the donors to the Seminarian Fund at Grace. These contributions have been invaluable to me during this first year of school. As you can imagine, expenses add up quickly in the higher education field. I can assure you that all I've learned thus far has deepened my faith and has further solidified my call to serve and help others strengthen their relationship with God.

As my first academic year wraps up, here are the classes I have taken so far at The United Lutheran Seminary:

- 1. Biblical Greek
- 2. Systematic Theology (this class was titled Creation/Sin/New Creation and we explored key aspects of Christian theology such as Creation, the Trinity, Sin and Heaven)
- 3. Environment and Faith (we learned about environmental history, ecological theology, and how to lead outdoor ministry)
- 4. Introduction to Preaching the Gospel
- 5. Reading and Telling the Story (an intro Bible class to learn about the geography and history of the Bible Land, and how to critically read the Bible)
- 6. The Story of Jesus (a study of who Jesus was and is, while studying the Gospels)

I am registered for two week-long intensive classes this summer; one in June and one in August before the fall semester starts again in late August.

A bit about how I am called to serve:

Lutherans are a priesthood of all believers so that makes each one of us ministers of our faith, but in the ELCA there are two groups of people who are called to go through theological training and a candidacy process. These two rosters for ordination are Word & Sacrament, which is a Pastor, and Word & Service, which is a Deacon.

We all know the role of a Pastor but maybe aren't as familiar with a Deacon, which is my call. A good image to think of is a bridge between the church and the world. Deacons are called to take the church into the world and then bring the world into the church, and to equip people to live their faith out in the world. The word Deacon comes from the Greek word Diakonia, meaning servant. Maybe you've heard of it before. Diakonia is the care that Christians offer to all of creation, through Christ's compassion and teachings.

Deacons are not ordained in the sacraments: communion and baptism. They serve alongside a Pastor in a congregation or serve in community organizations.

I have a few more years of seminary and internships before I'm ready for a call but I wanted to give you all a small overview of my journey with some background info on Deacons in the ELCA. I hope to share more with you as the months go on.

The members of Grace have been a tremendous inspiration and support to me during this first year of seminary. Your prayers are very much appreciated and fully received. You all will forever be an inspired part of my call. Thank you!

Grace's Book Club will next be reading "Strange Sally Diamond" by Liz Nugent.

Garnering media attention when she tries to incinerate her dead father, reclusive Sally Diamond, beginning to discover the horrors of her early childhood, steps into the world for the first time and soon finds her trust

issues severely challenged by a sinister voice from her past she does not remember.

About the Author

Liz Nugent worked as a stage manager in theatres in Ireland and toured internationally before writing extensively for radio and television drama.

Unravelling Oliver was published in 2014, hit the number 1 spot for several weeks and won Crime Novel of the Year at the Irish Book Awards.

Lying in Wait, published in 2016, went straight to number 1 and was chosen for the Richard & Judy Book Club. It won the Radio 1 Ryan Tubridy Listeners Choice Award at the Irish Book Awards.

In October 2017, Liz won the Irish Tatler Woman of the Year Award in Literature.

Skin Deep was published in 2018. It also went straight to number 1 in the bestsellers charts and scooped two awards at the An Post Irish Book Awards in Nov '18: Crime Novel of the Year AND the Radio 1 Ryan Tubridy Listener's Choice Award.

Little Cruelties (Our Little Cruelties) was published in 2020. Another number 1 bestseller, it topped the charts for fifteen weeks, was nominated for Crime Novel of the Year at the Irish Book Awards, long listed for a CWA award at Theakston Crime Festival at Harrogate. It was listed as one of the most recommended thrillers of the Year by the New York Times. Liz was presented with the James Joyce Medal for Literature (via Zoom!) in February 21 and was a Guest of Honour at Iceland Noir in November 21.
